From Cincinnati, OH - I-275 to Exit 5 (US 50) towards KY. US 50 to IN 56 towards Rising Sun following IN 56 out of Rising Sun. IN 56 merge onto IN 156 to right North Landing. Left on Antioch 2.8 miles. Dagaz Acres is 42 Antioch Ln.

From Indianapolis, IN - Take I-74 East to 275 South Exit 5 towards KY. US 50 to IN 56 towards Rising Sun following IN 56 out of Rising Sun. IN 56 merge onto IN 156 to right North Landing. Left on Antioch 2.8 miles. Dagaz Acres is 42 Antioch Ln.

From Louisville, KY - I-71 North towards Cincinnati. Exit at Sparta (Exit 57) and turn right on to Hwy. 35 North. continue across the Markland Dam. At stop sign make a left onto Hwy 156 proceed 2.5 miles turn left onto Little Hominy Ridge/Turtle Creek, proceed up the hill go 3 miles turn right at end of Little Hominy/Turtle Creek onto Hwy 250 1.5 miles turn left onto Antioch. Dagaz Acres is 42 Antioch Ln.
